

CARTAGENA - PANORAMIC SIGHTSEEING TOUR

This is an opportunity to experience the uniquely magnificent city of Cartagena de Indias from the comfort of your airconditioned motor coach. Cartagena is a UNESCO World heritage site and a living breathing city that has been remarkably well preserved. Departing from the pier side and accompanied by expert local guides your first stop will be a panoramic view of the imposing military fort of San Felipe de Barajas, which is situated outside the walled city. This immense building is considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World with its construction beginning in 1536 and lasting for 121 years. Move on to Getsemani, one of the city's historical and most storied neighbourhoods, home to lovely colonial architecture and an authentic Colombian vibe that have made it such a popular spot in recent years. You will then continue to the historic colonial city. The immense walls took 194 years to be completed and enabled Cartagena to defend itself from the numerous attacks of English pirates and other would be invaders. The Spanish colonial architecture is some of the most impressive and best preserved in South America with its imposing merchant's houses, narrow streets, flower bedecked balconies stunning civic buildings and beautiful churches. You will continue to Bocagrande, which in complete contrast with the old city, is modern with high rise apartment complexes, hotels and restaurants. Here you will have the opportunity to visit the wonderful world of emeralds in Caribe jewelry and their Emerald museum, before returning to the port. This museum also keeps the legendary 260 pounds PETRA, the largest emerald bearing vein ever unearthed in Colombia with more than sixty crystals with terminations weighing more than two thousand carats.





COSTA RICA - SCENIC DRIVE, CULTURAL SHOW & SHOPPING

Esparza sits on the Gulf of Nicoya, in the Puntarenas province. It is one of the oldest cities in Costa Rica, founded in the 16th century by the Spanish. Your scenic drive will start by heading east to Esparza, one of the most picturesque towns in Costa Rica's Central Pacific region. The central park and its church are emblematic of Costa Rica's hardworking rural towns. Local dancers in colourful costumes will greet you at the park for a cultural show where you can enjoy the masquerades and learn about the local traditions, you will also have a chance to browse for some handmade souvenirs. Continuing on your scenic drive you will go on some stretches along the Pacific Ocean and pass by mango and cashew plantations. You will also be able to observe the birds that thrive in this environment thanks to the sustainable practices followed here. Your journey continues as you head down to sea level, admiring the sweeping views and green rolling hills covered by pasture lands. With the ocean in the distance be sure to browse around and find different traditional products, such as fresh tropical fruits, cashew seeds, "cajetas" and "cocadas" (traditional candy), plantain chips, cold drinks and many other typical snacks, giving you a great opportunity to sample their delicious fruits and taste a great cup of Costa Rican coffee.





SAN DIEGO HARBOR CRUISE

See the famous sea lions along with San Diego landmarks and historical sites with a San Diego harbour cruise. From the pier, a short walk brings you to your vessel for a narrated sightseeing cruise through San Diego Harbor. The narrated 2-hour cruise shows you the San Diego skyline, the Star of India and the iconic ships of the Maritime Museum, Harbor Island, Shelter Island and North Island Naval Air Station. U.S.S. Midway aircraft carrier, the U.S. Navy surface fleet, the Coronado waterfront, the Coronado Navy SEAL Base, and Coronado Bay Bridge. Your professional guide will share entertaining facts and history that helped to shape the city's distinctive waterfront. The fleet of luxury ships features three levels with comfortable indoor and outdoor seating, 360-degree views, and an on-board snack bar offering snacks, sodas, beer and wine for purchase. At the conclusion of the voyage, a short walk returns you to the ship, or you may want to linger on the waterfront an explore the area.





SAN FRANCISCO & GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE

San Francisco, in northern California, is a hilly city on the tip of a peninsula surrounded by the Pacific Ocean and San Francisco Bay. It's known for its year-round fog, iconic Golden Gate Bridge, cable cars and colorful Victorian houses. The Financial District's Transamerica Pyramid is its most distinctive skyscraper. In the bay sits Alcatraz Island, site of the notorious former prison. From the pier, depart along the Embarcadero towards downtown San Francisco then up the centre of town via Market Street to the top of one of the Twin Peaks. Here, far removed from the traffic below, is one of the most beautiful and peaceful places in all of San Francisco. Pause to admire the view over downtown and across the bay (if not obscured by the city's famous fog). From the belvedere, head down into Golden Gate Park and then to the Pacific coast for a photo stop overlooking the Cliff House and the endless beach nearby. Continue north through the Presidio, to view the iconic Golden Gate Bridge. Here you pause at the pavilion visitors center which offers excellent views of the bridge and informative information and representations of the bridge's history and engineering. The ample shop offers souvenirs and books memorializing the city and structure. You can also make an optional stop at lively Fisherman's Wharf. You may choose to depart the tour here and explore the area on the own. A short walk will bring you back to the ship when you are done exploring.





Tour description and Useful Info PEARL HARBOR TOUR

The Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on 7 December 1941 was "a day that will live in infamy", President Roosevelt said. Learn about this event that brought the United States into World War II and view the lovely city of Honolulu, once the capital of independent Kingdom of Hawaii. Learn about the Pacific theatre of World War II, from the surprise attack on Pearl Harbor on 7 December 1941 to the surrender of the Japanese on the deck of the battleship U.S.S. Missouri in 1945. This tour includes round trip transportation and features the historic museums and iconic views as well as a self-guided visit at the Pearl Harbor Visitor Center including the Bookstore, Road to War Museum, Attack Museum and Remembrance Circle. lease note: limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. No bags Permitted on this tour. The US Department of the Interior has instituted strict security measures at the Arizona Memorial . No purses, handbags, backpacks, camera bags, and other items that offer concealment are allowed in the Visitor Center. A camera is permitted. Please bring vital items in a manner that they can be placed in your pockets. Any bags brought on tour will need to be stored at an on-site storage area at \$5.00 per bag (cash only). The tour does not include the ticket neither for the Arizona Memorial and USS Bowfin (both on site at Pearl Harbor) nor for the USS Missouri, USS Oklahoma, Pacific Aviation (all three off site of Pearl Harbor on Ford Island). Tickets for venues not included in the tour price can be purchased on a first come first serve basis, at Pearl Harbor. Any questions can be addressed by the Park official on-site. Should you decide to purchase one of these tickets, please consider the time slot and the departure time of your return transportation. Please allow ample time as the return transportation to the ship won't be able to wait past the established departure time from Pearl Harbor.





AUCKLAND MUSEUM AND CITY SIGHTS

explore beautiful Auckland on a narrated driving tour. We'll drive past the neo-classical Auckland Museum, home to exhibits on New Zealand and Pacific Islands cultures with a collection of Polynesian artefacts that can be explored independently. As you arrive in downtown, you will note the contrasts in architectural styles. See the colonial-era shops that line the charming streets of the exclusive Parnell Village shopping district. Cross Harbour Bridge and continue through the city for the completion of your tour and a return to port. Please note: this tour is unsuitable for guests using a wheelchair. Guides in languages other than English are limited. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. The tour may have multiple departures during the day.





BEST OF BUSAN

While Busan is a highly popular seaside resort and South Korea's second largest city, it is to its appealing hinterland and the Haedong Yonggungsa Temple in its hillside location that this half-day outing will take you. After an initial coach transfer, you'll reach the temple, which dates to 1376, via a set of 108 steps, flanked by stone lanterns and the sea beyond. You'll have a little time to view the beautiful building before you move on to Dongbaekseom Island and its super-modern Nurimaru APEC House, a circular building made chiefly of glass that sits amid a landscape planted with camellias and pine trees. Last up, you'll get to visit Gamcheon Culture Village, a southern suburb that was once a shanty town and has recently undergone a major art-centric transformation. A walk through the colourful alleyways will reveal numerous murals, sculptures, playful art installations and even a charming statue of Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's Little Prince which overlooks the harbour. Your return to the ship then brings the tour to a close. Please note: the tour is unsuitable for guests of limited mobility or using a wheelchair. Guides in languages other than English are limited. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only.





HISTORIC HIGHLIGHTS OF DA NANG

Explore the historic and architectural highlights of Da Nang, the commercial and educational hub of Central Vietnam, and its environs. The tour begins when you board a coach and leave the port to visit the Da Nang Museum, located within the precinct of the national historic relic of Dien Hai Citadel, in the central Hai Chau district. The new museum was opened in 2011 and holds valuable documents and exhibits about the history of Da Nang and the surrounding area. Your next destination is the Son Tra district, bordered on three sides by water and popular with tourists. From here, you'll head to the area known locally as Bai But to visit the famous Linh Ung Pagoda, the most important in Central Vietnam in terms of both its scale and the quality of its architecture. Inside, in a courtyard, the Lady Buddha Da Nang statue rises majestically to a height of 67 metres, making it the tallest Buddha in Vietnam. Your tour then draws to a close with your return to the ship. Please note: as the visited sites are wheelchair-accessible (but without ramps), the tour is suitable for guests who use a wheelchair provided they are accompanied by a paying helper to aid with getting on/off the coach. Wheelchairs must be foldable/collapsible, as the coach has no ramps or lifts. Once on board, please contact the Shore Excursions' Desk staff promptly so they can help make arrangements. The number of guides in languages other than English is limited. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. Guests are requested to wear conservative attire for visiting places of religious importance





NEW WONDERS OF DUBAI

This discovery tour begins with a photo stop at the epitome of modern Dubai, the sumptuous Burj Al Arab Hotel, which is the only 7-star hotel in the world. The tour continues with a drive to the Palm Jumeirah, a magnificent man-made archipelago of islands in the shape of a palm tree where the impressive Atlantis Hotel is located. The next stop on the tour is the beautiful Dubai Marina, projected to become the largest man-made marina in the world. Next on the itinerary is a drive along Sheikh Zayed Road, taking you to the Souk Al Bahar where you will have free time to spend in the bazaar. The souk features over 100 shops in an eclectic retail mix that includes restaurants, cafés and lounges that flank the souk's extensive waterfront promenade. Literally meaning "The Market of the Sailor", Souk Al Bahar derives its name both from its traditional souk architecture – natural stone corridors, high archways and subdued lighting – as well as its unique "seaside" location on an island in Lake Burj. Please note: Wheelchair users must be accompanied by a paying helper to aid with getting on and off the coach; wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable since the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Wheelchair users wishing to take part in this are requested to contact the Shore Excursions' Desk promptly once they are on board so that arrangements can be made.





PANORAMIC CABO GIRAO & RIBEIRA BRAVA

Head to the Pico da Torre vantage point for the superb panoramic view, then continue up to Cabo Girão, the world's second-highest cliff face. The outlook from the safety railings is out of this world and it's a great place from which to take photos, but the views are equally lovely from a little way back. The final leg of the tour begins with a 1-hour drive to Ribeira Brava. Situated on the southwest of Madeira, this pretty little town is a hive of street cafés and shops. The town's name is believed to be derived from the wild (Brava) river (Ribeira) that used to regularly wreak havoc in the area. Your tour concludes with your return to Funchal and the ship. Please note: comfortable shoes and a coat recommended. Wheelchair users must be accompanied by a paying helper to aid with getting on and off the coach; wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable since the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Wheelchair users wishing to take part in this are requested to contact the Shore Excursions' Desk promptly once they are on board so that arrangements can be made. Visibility from scenic outlooks depend on weather conditions the day of call.





MARVELLOUS METRO MANILA, OLD AND NEW

Discover fascinating, multicultural Metropolitan Manila, one of the most densely packed urban areas in the world. Your tour begins with a scenic drive from Pier 15 through the grounds of the Cultural Centre of the Philippines. Look out for the Philippine International Convention Centre and the Folk Arts Theatre and next door, the Coconut Palace – a building made mostly from coconut materials! After a photo stop at Rizal Park, continue into the country's financial capital, the City of Makati. Drive down Ayala Avenue, home of the Philippine banking industry, onwards through Forbes Park, dubbed "Millionaire's Row," then on to the impressive American Cemetery and Memorial. Driving back to old Manila, you'll reach Intramuros – "The Walled City" – to see the centuries-old fortified walls, church ruins and relics from Spain's Conquistadores. Enjoy a photo stop at the Cathedral then head to Fort Santiago, a Spanish fort overlooking the entrance to Pasig River, for a visit before returning to the ship. Please note: comfortable shoes and a coat recommended. This tour includes climbing 50 steps to reach the Fort; Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. Limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only.





HIGHLIGHTS OF KUALA LUMPUR

Batu Caves is a limestone outcrop located just north of Kuala Lumpur, with a series of caves featuring Hindu temples and shrines. Its other attractions include the huge statue of the Hindu deity Murugan at the entrance, and the steep climb up its 272 steps to finally view the stunning skyline of the city. The next visit on this tour is the National Monument, an enormous bronze monument built to pay tribute to the soldiers who gave their lives during the Communist Insurgency in the 1950s. After lunch at a local restaurant, the next stop will be a photo opportunity at the Petronas Twin Towers, an architectural wonder and the pride of Malaysia. Your tour will conclude with a photo stop at Independence Square, where you will see the 328-foot flagpole marking the spot where the Malaysian flag was hoisted to mark the country's independence from British rule. Please note: this tour is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties or using a wheelchair. Limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. Guests are requested to wear conservative attire for visiting the Batu Caves: tank tops, sleeveless shirts and shorts are strictly prohibited for women wishing to enter the caves. The Temple authority may demand payment for additional garments should inappropriately dressed women wish to enter. Guest can take snapshots of Petronas Twin Tower only from a distance during the final photo stop. You may find monkeys on the staircase leading to the Caves; they are not aggressive but please avoid carrying any plastic bag or food and do not provoke them. Only coffee, tea and a bottle of water are included in the lunch; any other drink must be paid with local currency or credit cards.





PANORAMIC SHANGHAI & MAGLEV TRAIN

Get your fill of all things Shanghai on a mostly coach-based excursion that promises to deliver the best of the city. The first must-see is the Shanghai Maglev Train, whose magnetic levitation technology ensures a distance of 30 km/18 miles can be covered in just under 7.5 minutes at a top speed of 431 km/h (268 mph). The tour continues as the photo stop at Jin Mao Tower. Then you will be transferred over Nanpu Bridge to the French Concession, a Shanghai district under French rule from 1849 to 1946. Your tour guide will tell you about the quarter's history, after which you'll have some time to spend at its shopping and entertainments hub, the upscale Xintiandi, before you head back to your ship. Please note: this tour is not suitable for guests with walking difficulties or using a wheelchair. Limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. Train may not reach the maximum speed.





DISCOVERING SYDNEY

This half-day guided tour gives you a chance to check out key sights from the comfort of a modern coach. Your stress-free jaunt begins directly next to Harbour Bridge in the city's oldest quarter, The Rocks. Look forward to an appealing blend of Victorian-era buildings and modern architecture, after which you'll head for city-centre sights such as the Sydney Tower – the city's tallest structure – as well as the 19th-century Queen Victoria Building, Chinatown and Mrs. Macquarie's Chair, a sandstone bench created for the wife of the then Governor Macquarie in 1810. This vantage point, perched at the end of a peninsula on Farm Cove, provides fabulous views of Sydney Harbour Bridge and the iconic Opera House, your next port of call. Following a short guided tour of the well-known building, you'll head for Sydney's most exclusive residential area at Watsons Bay, complete with a surfeit of high-end yachts, for a chance to take photos of the Sydney skyline. Next up is the surfing nirvana of Bondi Beach for another photo stop, after which the return journey to your ship will see you travel through Paddington, a district most noted for its pretty terraced houses with ironwork balconies. Please note: guests are recommended to wear sunscreen, sunglasses, comfortable walking shoes and a light sweater or cardigan. The tour involves some walking around the Opera House and approximately 200 steps throughout the Opera House tour, which is not wheelchair accessible and for guests with mobility problems. Limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only.





A GLIMPSE OF TOKYO

he sights of Tokyo are presented for your viewing pleasure on this half-day outing, which begins with a coach transfer to the Hamarikyu Gardens. Forming a welcome green contrast to the skyscrapers of the Shiodome District, the wooded park area also features seawater ponds with water levels varying depending on the tide and even one with an island and a teahouse. Next, you'll move on to the historical Asakusa quarter to stroll down Nakamise, a busy shopping street, en route to the 7th-century Sensō-ji Temple, one of the district's key landmarks. After a photo stop a the late 19th-century and moated Imperial Palace, which occupies space formerly taken up by Edo Castle, you'll get back on the coach for the short drive back to the ship. Please note: the number of guides in languages other than English is limited. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. Wheelchair guests must be accompanied by a paying helper to aid with getting on and off the coach; wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable since the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Wheelchair users wishing to take part in this are requested to contact the Shore Excursions' Desk promptly once they are on board so that arrangements can be made.
